

## VP – Participation Report



SWDSI's Campus Representative Program exists to promote DSI/SWDSI membership, webinars, and conference participation. Our goal is to grow SWDSI and increase participation each year by identifying and attracting new members. The program has grown to 24 SWDSI campus representatives. Due in part to word of mouth promotion, we had 225 people attend across the six webinars in Fall 2020 and Spring 2021. As a campus representative, we ask you to disseminate the call for papers and other announcements while encouraging your colleagues to join us. Even if you are not an official SWDSI campus representative, you can still help by inviting those you know (even those working outside the Southwest region) to make SWDSI their region by submitting to the conference, attending a webinar or participating in some other way.

We continue reaching out to past conference attendees and those indicating SWDSI as their region of choice to recruit campus representatives and members.

Please consider volunteering by contacting Pamela Rogers ([Pamela.Rogers@sfasu.edu](mailto:Pamela.Rogers@sfasu.edu)). Let her know other ways you would like to participate in SWDSI (track chair, session chair, webinar presenter, committees, board member, etc.); she will pass that information to the appropriate officer or committee chair.

Lastly, whether you renew DSI membership during the year or when registering for the DSI Annual Meeting, make sure you mark SWDSI as your primary regional affiliation. It is critical for our members to check the SWDSI box when paying DSI membership dues. This is the only official way to maintain your SWDSI affiliation. The DSI Home Office collects and disseminates information based on who checks that box. This includes information related to specific regional interests such as DSI board elections. DSI members also receive a discounted registration price for the SWDSI conference, so all of you are encouraged to join DSI to enjoy the benefits of membership and officially be counted. All SWDSI officers and board members are required to maintain current membership in DSI and participate in SWDSI activities including the conference and all officer/board meetings.

**Competitive Papers.** Full-length competitive papers are invited on, but not limited to, the topic areas listed below. All submitted papers will be reviewed by qualified individuals and through a double-blind peer review process. In addition, we welcome the submission of up to one-page single spaced research abstracts (150-300 words). Acceptance of papers and abstracts are subject to final approval by the Track Chairs/Program Chair. Accepted papers and abstracts of authors who have registered for the conference by the close of online registration will be scheduled for presentation at the annual meeting. Presented papers and abstracts will be published in the Proceedings (available on SWDSI website only). Paper submission acknowledges that the author(s) will register for and attend the conference, and personally present the accepted paper at the time specified in the conference program.

**Submission Policy.** The submission of a paper or abstract means the author certifies it is not copyrighted, has not been accepted for publication in a journal or proceedings, has not been presented at another professional meeting, has not been accepted for presentation at another professional meeting, and is not under review for a journal, proceedings, or presentation at another professional meeting. Concurrent submission and/or presentation of the same or similar paper at another conference is considered a breach of professional ethics. DSI has a code of ethical conduct accessible at <https://decisionsciences.org/discover-dsi/governance/code-of-conduct/>.

**Program Participation.** Paper reviewers and session chairs are needed for the program to be a success. Please contact the Program Chair or a Track Chair by October 4, 2021, if interested in serving as session chair or reviewer. Authors who submit papers should expect to be asked to review at least one paper for the conference. Symposia, tutorials, and workshops on current topics are invited. Please contact the Program Chair concerning these proposals.

**Distinguished Paper Awards.** Distinguished paper awards will be presented to outstanding papers.

**Student Papers and Consortium.** Up to three cash awards for student papers will be presented. Papers submitted in the student track must be solely of student authorship. Watch the SWDSI website for information about the Doctoral Student Consortium.
